Dear Mr. Donaldson,

I'm sorry to hear you haven't received the books invoiced on Hous.-1 (or 3387/8) sent 4 Feb. '84. Today we put a trace on it at the post office. I can't hold out much hope for the trace doing any good. If customs seized it, we will get back a copy of the notice of seizure sent to the recipient - we did send the box to Nigel Kemp, by the way. I don't think customs may seize goods without sending a notice of seizure to the recipient, so Nigel should certainly have received the notice by now if the goods were seized.

Our experience has been that goods take 4 to 6 weeks to get from Philadelphia to London, so, yes, the goods are long overdue.

As a precaution we've not put "Giovanni's Room" on the outside of the packages to the U.K. for two to three months. Because 4 Feb. is slightly longer than three months, "Giovanni's Room" may have appeared on the package. I'll certainly let you know if we hear from the post office.
